There are 52 credits (13 courses) required for Graduation:

Career-Life Education (4 credits)

Career-Life Connections (4 credits)

Physical and Health Education 10 (4 credits)

Science 10 (4 credits) and Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)

Social Studies 10 (4 credits) and Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)

A Math 10 (4 credits) and A Math 11 or 12 (4 credits)

An English 10, 11 and a required 12 (12 credits total)

Fine Arts Education 10, 11, or 12 or Applied Skills, 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits total)

There are 28 credits (7 courses) elective courses required for Graduation



Post-Secondary Entrance Facts

Each PSI Has Specific Entrance Requirements
Each Faculty / Program Also Has Entrance Requirements
Each PSI Sets Their Own Minimum Grade/Average for Entrance
Each Year The Minimum GPA Needed For Entrance Changes

*GPA Needed for Acceptance is a Moving Target which is why you need to strive to have the highest marks you can in your courses required for entrance!

* Many students who only meet the minimum requirements for Entrance are **NOT** accepted as students with higher marks get in first

ONLINE COURSES

Many PSI request that online courses are completed Semester 1 or early Spring

It is YOUR responsibility to show Proof of Registration/Completion to your PSI

*Often VSS is not given this info until a Later date

G.P. A. (AVERAGE) Is Calculated by Using

This average is what establishes your RANK among other applicants

*Elective courses NOT required for entrance will be omitted when Calculating your Average

ALL PSI HAVE An Online Application Process

It is Recommended to Apply to a Minimum of 2 Schools

- Keep your options open
- Programs can be VERY competitive
- Applications require a fee for processing which is non-refundable (credit card, prepaid credit card, cheque or in person payment)

What do I need to apply

Demographic information

- Name, address, phone number, etc.
 Personal Ministry of Education Number
- Social Insurance Number (tax receipt)
 - Grade 10 and 11 Marks (Transcript)





Various Types of Financial Acknowledgment

Award: Is given in recognition of outstanding achievement. May be in the form of books, plaques, or monetary reward.


Bursary: A non-repayable grant of money bursaries are awarded primarily based on financial need, but academic achievement is also considered. Usually the applicant must provide detailed documentation describing their financial situation when applying for a bursary

Scholarship: A non-repayable sum of money awarded to a student to help finance further education. Most scholarships are based on merit in areas ranging from academic achievement to athletics. Usually scholarships are not based on financial need.

Entrance Award/Scholarship: A scholarship or award given to a student entering his/her first year at a post-secondary institution. Also referred to as an Admission Award which is offered by the Post Secondary Institution.

In-course Award/Scholarship: Awarded to students already enrolled in post-secondary studies, beyond the first year level.

International/National



National / International/Provincial

- EXTREMELY Competitive
- Numerous Applicants Few Recipients
- Grades plus factors specific to the organization
 - (humanitarian service/ innovator/leader)
- Applications are comprehensive, often requiring reference letters, nominations, essays and transcripts

The Ministry will determine recipients based on students' achievement in Grades 10, 11, and 12 courses that satisfy graduation program requirements (including elective courses).

Astudent can receive only one BCAchievement Scholarship in their lifetime.

The Ministry will mail this Scholarship directly to students by October of their Grad year (2024)

Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship

- awarded to 20 outstanding high school graduates who's career path is K-12 teaching.
- \$5000 Tuition Scholarship
- A student cannot win both a Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship and a BC Excellence Scholarship.

District Project Based Scholarship Categories

- Fine Arts
 - e.g., Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music
- Applied Skills
 - e.g., Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics
- Physical Activity
 - e.g., Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical Education
- Second Languages including Aboriginal Languages
- Community Service
- Volunteer Activity
- Technical and Trades Training
 - e.g., Carpentry, Automotive, Mechanics, Cook Training



Secondary School Apprenticeship Scholarship **\$1000**

- automatic consideration for the award.
- Must have completed the SD#22 Apprenticeship
- This student will be a Graduate
- Maintained a C+ average on Grade 12 numbered courses
- Reported a total of at least 900 hours to the ITA by December 31st of the year the student turns 19

Tips for Scholarships

Some Scholarships already have applications available, but the Majority of Scholarships are posted after Christmas

Most Scholarships are due between Feb – April

Important that your resume is current

Important that you have letters of reference to support your application(s)

Important that you PAY ATTENTION to deadlines.

Important Scholarship Factors To Consider

```
Year of Study (entrance, first year, final year, graduate)
```

Special Circumstances (visual impairment, orphan, etc.)

Financial Need

Academic Average (GPA)

Heritage (Aboriginal, German, Polish, etc.)

Field of Study (the program you're interested or currently in)

<u>Affiliation</u> (companies, religious groups, unions, and associations, that you or your family are affiliated with)

Activities (sports, religious, academic, leadership, community involvement, etc.)

Location (where you live and go to school)

Tips For Reference Letters

Consider carefully which teachers (or community person) from whom you may need a reference letter

The person you ask should know you **VERY** well so that they can write a meaningful letter. Their title is not as important as their ability to reference personally about you and your strengths.

You MUST supply your reference with a copy of your resume

You MUST allow your reference at least 2 weeks to write the letter


If you would like their letter for multiple applications, request that they print several copies for you at the same time

They may request that the letter remains confidential in which case it will be placed in your file but multiple copies will not be made

Please DO NOT request a letter unless you intend to use it

I have to be a great writer to earn a scholarship

 More important WHAT you write than how well it is written.

It is important that you meet the Criteria of the scholarship

Follow the instructions and address the essay question

If I'm A Top Academic Student Then I will Get a Scholarship

Often times you will be given a Local scholarship
BUT

Few Students Get Full Scholarships

- Always explore other options available
 - ~ Ministry of Education bursaries
 - ~ Student loans
 - ~ Get a Job!

I should apply to as many scholarships as possible to Increase My Chances

TRUE... But

You should only apply for scholarships that:

- 1. You meet the criteria for
- 2. Would be well suited for
- 3. You have a good chance of winning

Only Honour Roll Students get scholarships

Grades are very important

However, grades are only 1 way by Which_students are measured and evaluated.

Many Scholarships look at Several Aspects, NOT just marks!

I need to have a lot of extracurricular / volunteer

It's about quality, not quantity.
